



# NARENDRA MODI: THE GREAT REDEEMER AND PHILOSOPHER KING

Here, I see in Narendra Modi as an impressive grace and challenge capable of expanding this 'Modi model', in harmony with the Gandhian model, globally. Modi's firmness as a patriarch is his supreme greatness at this crucial juncture.

However, solution to a global problem today is suicidal if initiated by a single nation or even by a single superpower. And every problem of mankind today is global and it has to be tackled, on a war footing, only GLOBALLY. Today, practically or logically, there simply cannot be any individual or even sectarian solution to any chronic problem/disease that is more social than material, more mental than physical, more complex and civilizational than natural, more global and fundamental than anything provisional or superficial.

In a highly globalized hi-tech era, all the attempts for system changes, however inevitable and vital they be, will surely be risky and even suicidal for individuals or for any single nation to take them up individually. Mikhail Gorbachev, the former President of the erstwhile Soviet Union realized this tough reality the hard way when he ventured to do it single-handedly in Soviet Union in the event of which he not only ended up losing the Soviet empire itself but also his own position as the supreme global leader. The fact that the latterly resurgent Russia has slowly become a stronger nation with less decay and less poisonous baggage of the past is altogether another matter, the credit of which only goes to Mikhail Gorbachev, a fact which however very few people realize even today.

## THE PHILOSOPHER KING OF THE GLOBAL VILLAGE

A great leader gives life to the sleeping mass and helps them to awake and realize their own potential and power. He revives confidence, hope and courage in the people and unites them with a mutual dream of a progressive society.

Since the last forty years, despite of his frequent travels and political trips, Modi keeps an unflinching discipline of 10 days fast that he reportedly practices two times in a year. Modi is a staunch vegetarian who has never indulged in any kind of intoxications. Here, as a disciplined political leader, he is like Mahatma Gandhi. At times Modi seems to be much more of a nationalist and a more practical, modern and foresighted leader than Gandhiji himself.

Narendra Modi is a brilliant fusion of modernism and the essence of the vast Hindu philosophy. This has never been seen in any past leaders of India. Gandhiji was a religious man and had subtle understanding of Indian mysticism and spirituality, but he had not

But Nehru went sharply against the much sustainable and pollution-less Gandhian model in nation building.. However, I see Narendra Modi as a combination of Gandhi and Nehru. But I hope Modi, as a new global leader, will eventually shed the Nehru line (see box).

As a leader, Narendra Modi may be seen as new global 'VILLAGE ELDER' than any conventional professional leader, and he is capable of giving a human touch to leadership. In Modi, I can see a sage-like statesman and an enlightenment leader. And Modi, during his maiden trip to the United States as Indian Prime Minister, did not want to change his usual practice of fasting, which, like in the case of Gandhiji, is also a sure source of his enlightenment. And he proved his stamina and vibrant energy level in America by abstaining from food for days, throughout his grueling schedule that featured the United Nations General Assembly, a rally of Indian Americans at New York's Madison Square Garden and talks with President Obama in Washington.

Today we know that mankind is under the wrong modern systems since many years, and that this fragile world has to be brought under the right human hands to correct this aberration of modern age.

## **MODI MAGIC ARRESTING THE FAST DOWN-SLIDE IN INDIA**

From many visible indications, the western model is already broken. According to many published reports, Industrial civilisation is fast headed for irreversible collapse, on a global level. War or no war, mankind is soon to face extinction because of the massive premature degeneration gripping mankind, and the worst affected are the peoples of the so-called 'super' powers and developed nations. In Canada for example, the number of people who consider themselves atheists or agnostic rose significantly in the last ten years. Meanwhile in Finland, the number has doubled in the last twenty.

The numbers are highest in Northern Europe and in East Asia. If you took the median average estimate, Japan would be the country with the most atheists and agnostics, a title mostly associated with Scandinavian countries.

However, Sweden leads the way when it comes to those who don't practice religion with Norway not far behind. China is rather special here because a very small percentage considers themselves as atheists, but 93% don't subscribe to a specific religion.

Also countries with irreligion trends are growing at a faster rate than any religion-based countries. Although New Zealand has no established religion, Christianity has been the religion of the majority. However in their nation's survey, the majority population recorded as having 'no religion' over the last five censuses. About half of Americans say the growing number of "people who are not aliened to any religion. Sweden is among the least religious nations in the world.

Most countries in the world have no official religion. Today the world in the global village, is going forward, in many crucial respects, as a single nation. Here Hindus, even if they are all religious fanatics, constitute less than 14% of the global population, whereas the reality is that Hindus are the most secular sort of humans in the world, and Hinduism the most tolerant religion in the world, a historical fact which no historian can deny. How else could expand the Islamic world eastwards from the eleventh century to the eighteenth and Mughal kings ruled India for over two centuries and the Christian colonialist rulers reigned over this vast nation for three centuries?

We will be doing a mortal mistake if we are unable to rise to realities and do away with the foolish practice of bringing more politics into religion or more religion into politics. In this process, we will only be sabotaging our own escape bid from the imminent destruction and extinction of mankind, which actually is very much on the card.

As for the efficient and honest modernization drive by Modi, despite the opposing party (Congress) overruling him at the central government, Modi transformed Gujarat into European-level development. In order to misrepresent his image as an extremist Hindu leader and to deprive him of the 20% of Muslim votes, a well-planned defamation propaganda was orchestrated against him because of which the American government also denied him visa for a long time. But today the Muslim leaders themselves are praising Modi's delivery of security, employment and education to the Muslim community in Gujarat.

Modi takes his inspiration from Swami Vivekanand and other Indian mystics. Just before the elections, Modi reportedly had reached the Ramkrishna ashram in Belurmath and had expressed his desire to meditate in Swamijee's room. Today, when no-one is interested in actually trying to give a humanistic perspective to the most urgent problems of society, I was indeed surprised at the ease with which Modi was touching such knotty global issues like global warming and the crisis of education. Modi seems to take these highly knotty global problems more realistically and practically than those professional politicians handling difficult global issues by means of only the usual 'gesture politics'.

While addressing the students on Teachers' Day on 5th September, 2014, Prime Minister Narendra Modi, wooed many school kids across the nation with his witty answers, even as he was tackling those global issues. Here Modi has come out with the right explanation and definition of a long pestering global problem – global warming – which was put to him by the students and which have long caught the attention of most global leaders who meanwhile were in the dilemma solely due to their wrongly defining the problem itself.

In a world sharply divided by climate change supporters and climate deniers, Modi's, 'climate change' statement did touch the nucleus of the problem and gave the right angle to
